Grades 7-12</p> <p>PANTS: All pants and shorts must be secured at the waist. Pants must be the appropriate size, not too tight, not oversized. NO SAGGING.</p> <p>LENGTH: Shorts, skirts, skorts and dresses must be NO more than three (3) inches above the knee in the front and back.</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;">JEWELRY</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Jewelry should not be disruptive to the learning environment or a <u>safety issue.</u></p>
HAIR	SHOES	Dress For Success option (gr 7-12)
<p>Hair must be clean and well-groomed and should not impair vision or compromise student safety. Hairstyles and hair color should not be disruptive to the learning environment.</p> <p>NO head scarves, wrapcaps, dorags, bonnets, satin caps, or any related item.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Grades K-6 Tennis Shoes ONLY</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Grades 7-12 Choice of shoe as long as not a safety hazard, no heels higher than 2", no house shoes or athletic slides. Tennis shoes must be worn in PE.</p>	<p>As we prepare students to transition into the world of work, college, or military, we encourage students to wear business casual to business attire.</p> <p>This may be worn instead of the "top and bottom" uniform requirements. Guidelines will be shared with students the 1st nine weeks. This option will be available for 7th-12th grade students beginning the 2nd nine weeks.</p>
BACKPACKS/PURSES	JACKETS/COATS/SWEATERS/OUTERWEAR	
<p style="text-align: center;">Grades K-12 Clear Backpacks only</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Purses Grades K-12 Clutch size purses or smaller</p>	<p>Jackets and coats are considered outerwear and must be worn with a uniform shirt. Appropriately sized v-neck or crew pullover sweaters or sweatshirts (solid navy/black) may be worn. NO HOODS OR HATS IN THE BUILDING. HEAD MAY NOT BE COVERED DURING THE SCHOOL DAY. No "hoodies" may be worn in the school building during the school day.</p>	
<u>ITEMS NOT ALLOWED</u>		
<p>Yoga pants, jeggings, joggers, sweatpants / jogging pants, velour pants, leggings worn as pants, gym shorts / athletic shorts, over-sized clothing, clothing with cuts, slits, holes, or slashes, denim or jean fabric, sleeveless shirts, scoop or other shirts on top of "polo" shirt, overcoats or trench coats, blankets, removable "grills", caps, hats, bandanas, hair picks, sunglasses, sweatbands or athletic slides. Jackets may not be turned inside-out. Items or clothing suggestive of gangs, alcohol, drugs, tobacco, vulgarities, violence, or other inappropriate symbols are also prohibited.</p>		
TRANSFERS: Students who transfer from other school districts will be given five(5) days to come into compliance with the Tarrant Uniform Policy.		
KHAKI is defined by TCS to be light tan in color. No cream or off white allowed. NAVY – is defined by TCS to be a dark blue color. No jeans or denim allowed.		
<i>Students are expected to be in compliance with the uniform policy as long as they are on campus (between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 3:40 p.m.)</i>		
The local school principal will be the final authority for determining appropriate dress within the framework of the policy.		

All students attending the Tarrant Alternative Program (TAP) & PATHWAYS must be in uniform.
